

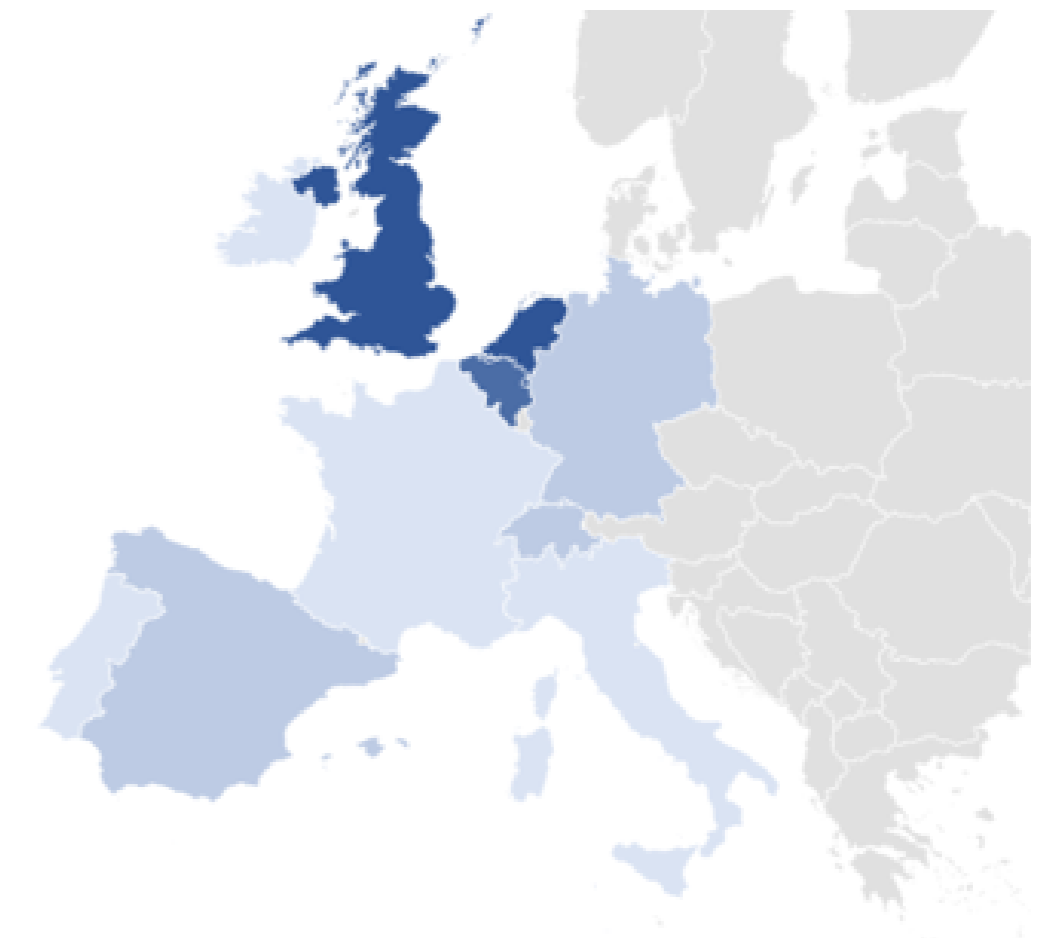
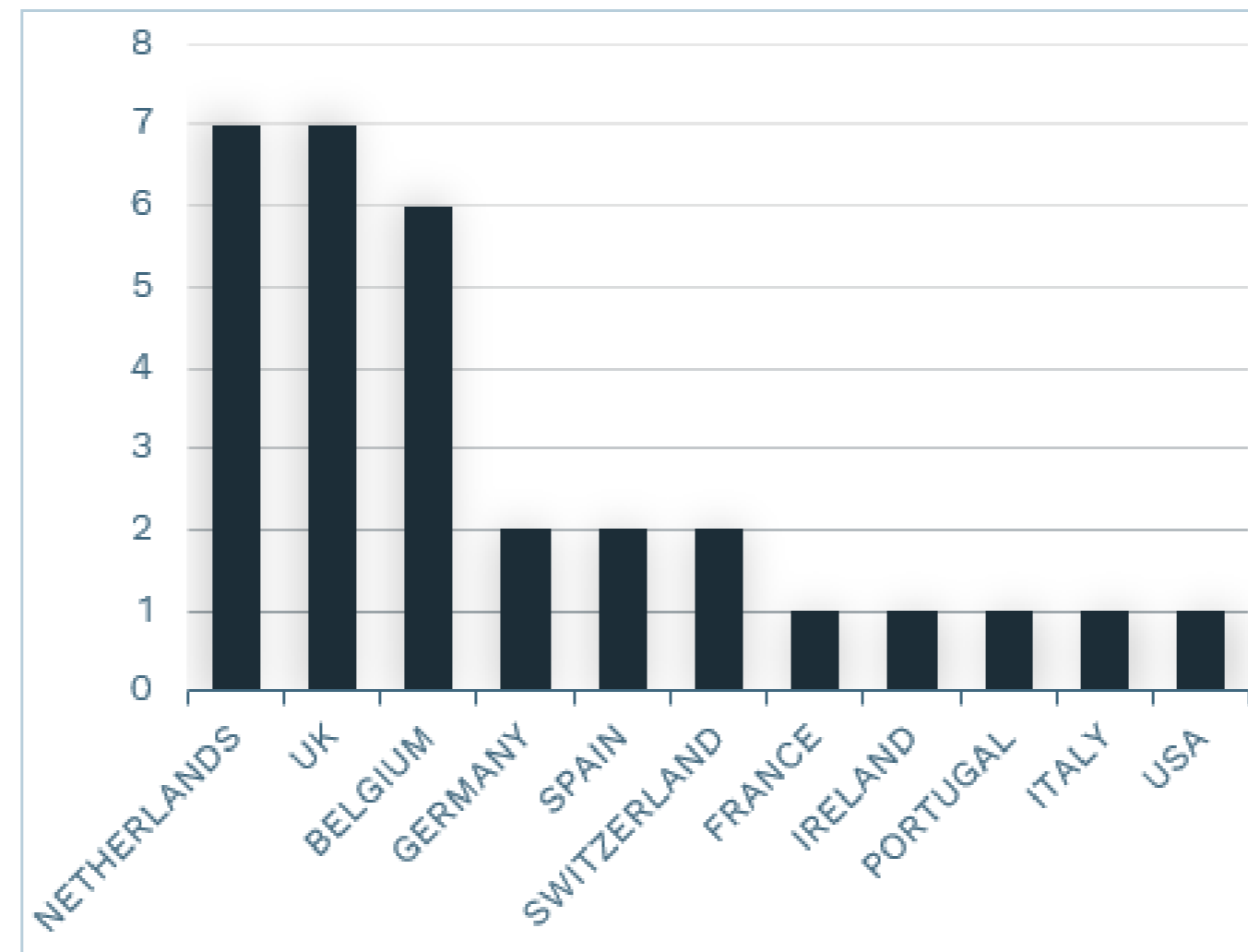

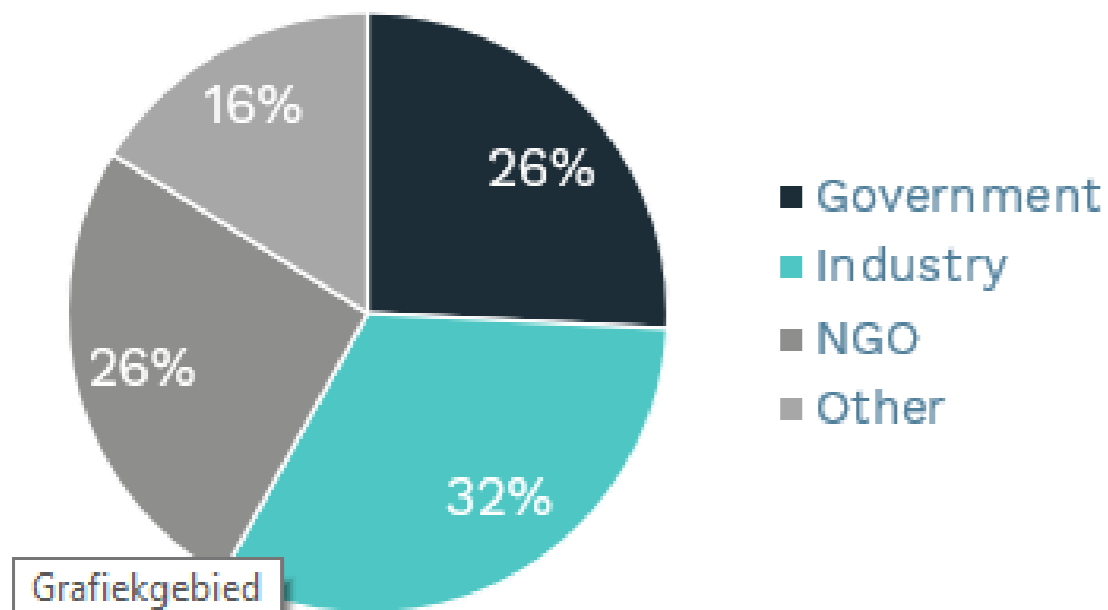
Distribution of funders within the network



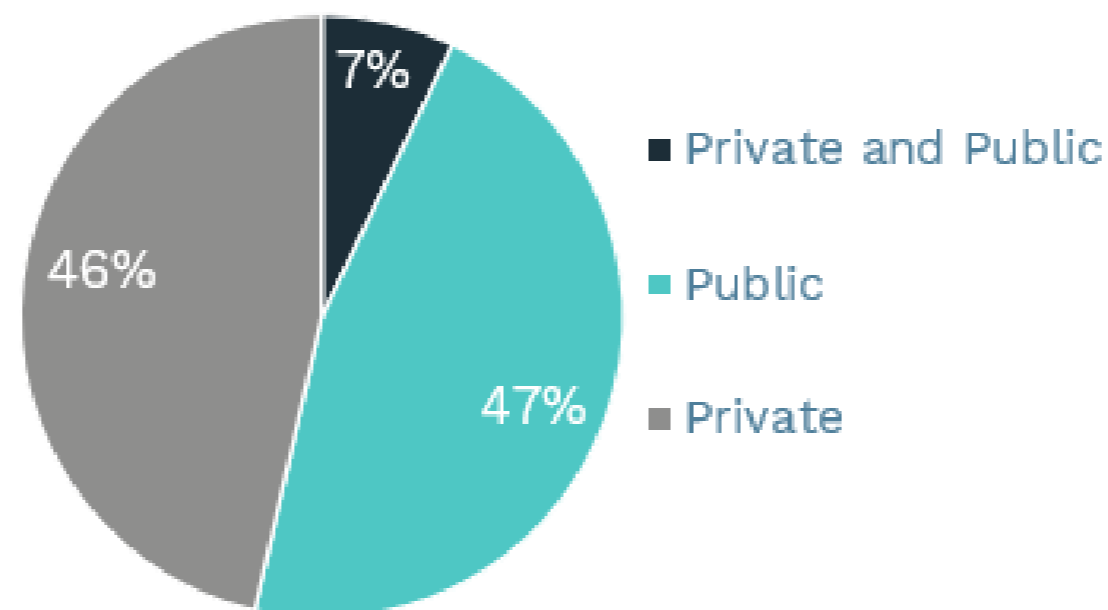

Distribution of funders within the network

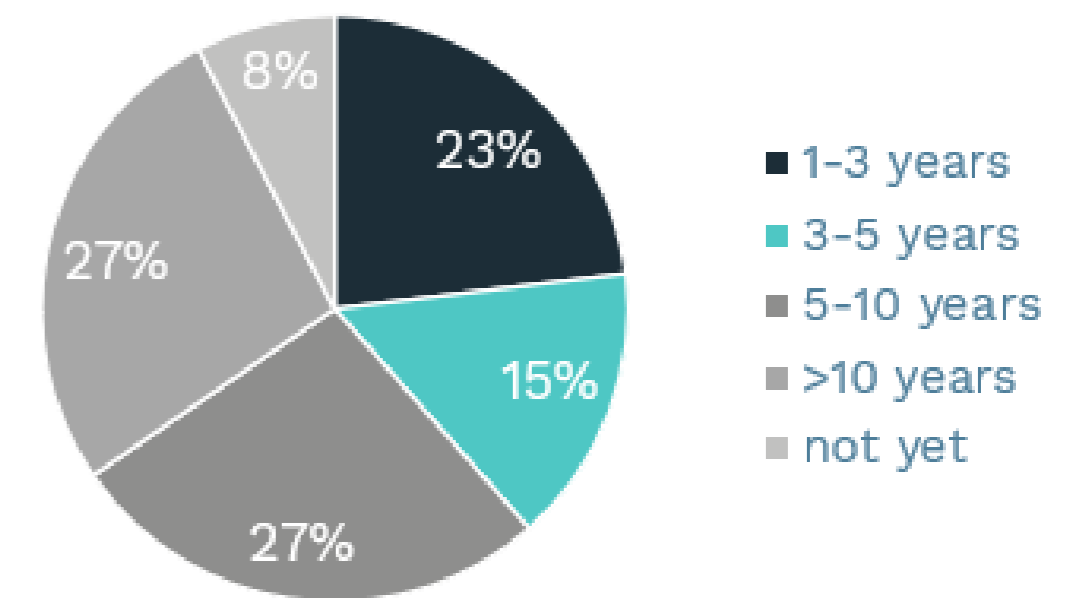
Type of organisation

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REMEDi4ALL Funders Network

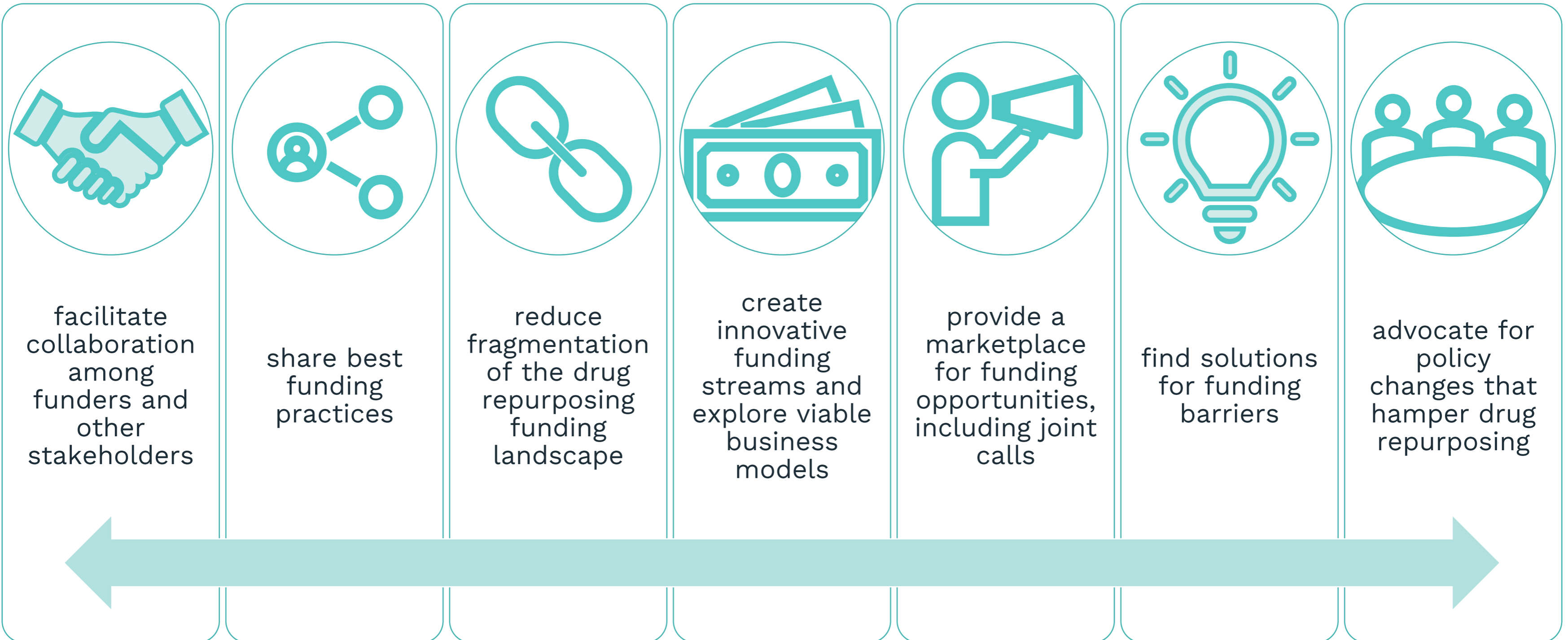
- A dynamic international network comprising diverse funders who are committed to drive drug repurposing forward.

- Established in October 2023 as part of EU-funded project REMEDi4ALL (R4ALL)

- Membership application form signed to join the network
- 27 members & 4 observers (status 1 March 2024) – more funders are welcome to join
- No financial or legal commitment
- We are not a funding entity



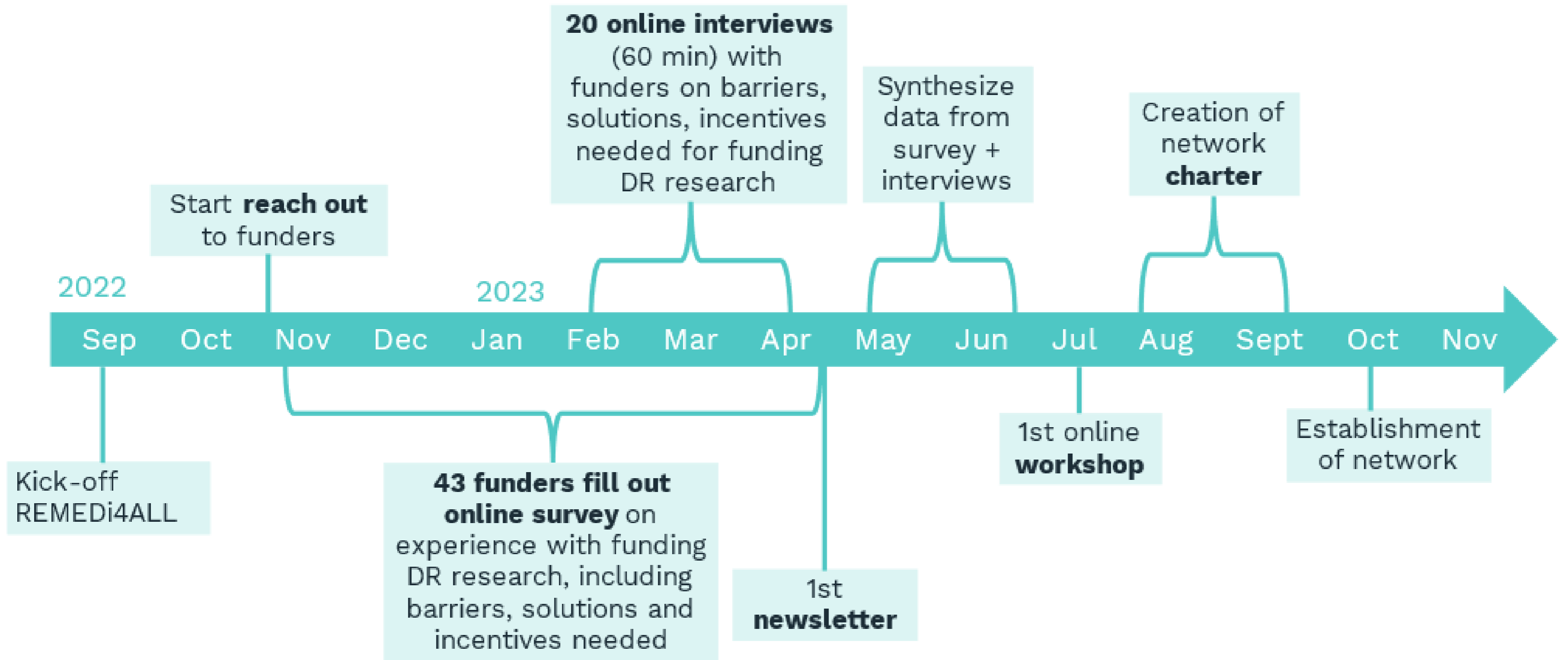

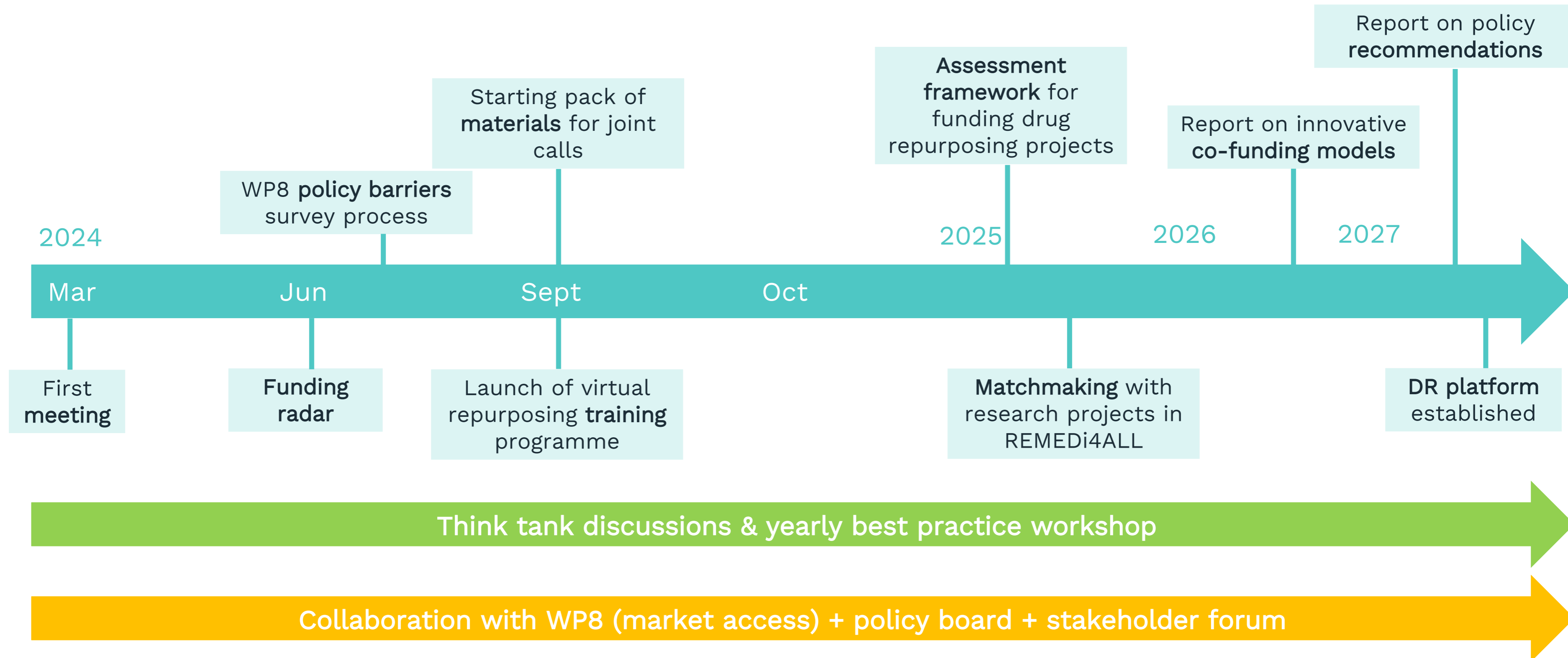

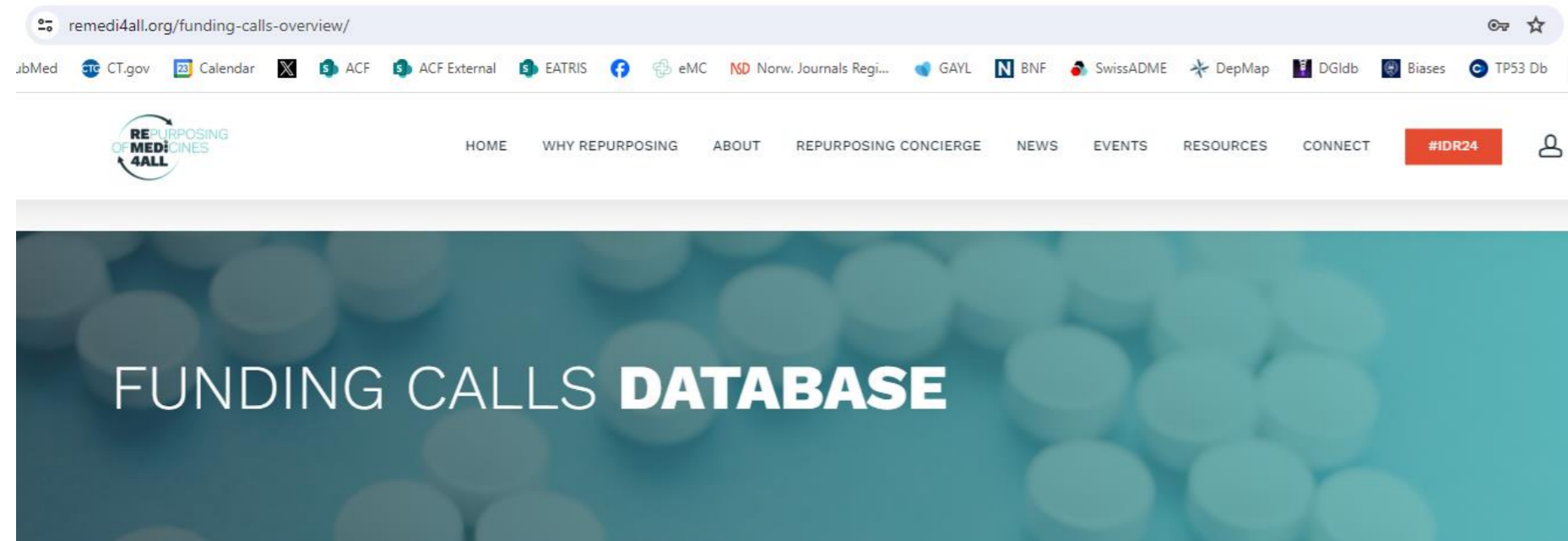

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Funding Radar – online match-making



The Funding Radar is an online database, hosted on the REMEDI4ALL website, that contains details of open funding calls that include drug repurposing projects

- Open access – no membership fees
- Includes filters by project category, disease area, geography etc.
- Supports email alerts for new funding calls
- Designed for funders and applicants interested in repurposing rather than general funding calls

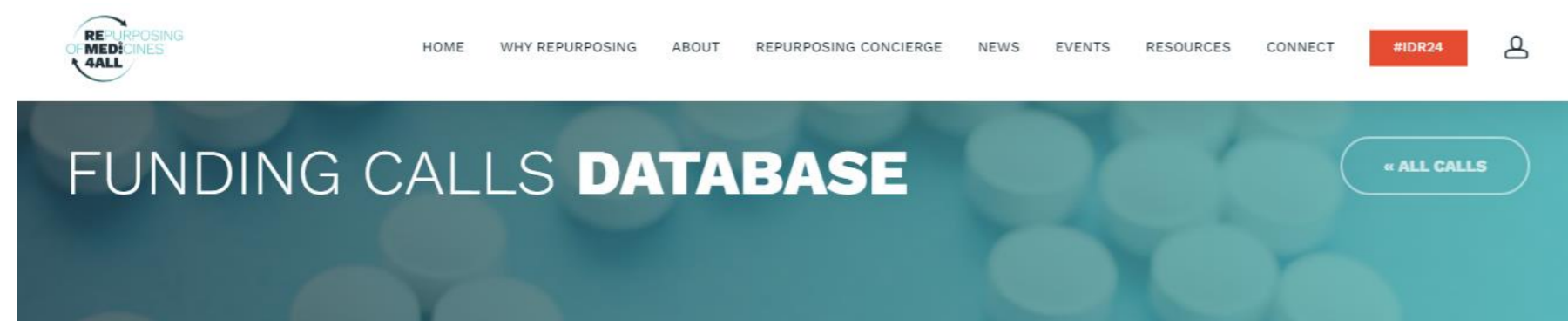

CALL FOR INNOVATIVE APPROACHES TO TACKLE NEUROBLASTOMA (ACTION)

Funder(s): [Anticancer Fund](#),

One RFA is a Research Funding Award launched by the ACTION Consortium, an international collaboration that has the ambition to find innovative approaches to tackle neuroblastoma.

The call is focused on refractory and relapsed neuroblastoma, calling for innovative approaches to accelerating clinical trials, and evaluation of novel therapies. By pooling our resources to form the ACTION Consortium, this award will be one of the largest seen in the neuroblastoma field, standing at \$2 million.

Founded by five non-profit organisations, Anticancer Fund (Belgium), The Evan Foundation (United States), Kindred Foundation (Canada), Solving Kids' Cancer (United Kingdom) and Zoé4Life (Switzerland), the ACTION Consortium is a collective force committed to Advancing Clinical Trial Implementation and Optimisation in Neuroblastoma.

Innovative funding models

Background: funding repurposing is hard because of market failure / exclusivity / licensing issues

Aim:

- Create / generate new funding streams/funds
- Share ideas & best practices (worldwide)
- Look at solutions in literature
- Examples: DRUP Trial (NL), Prize funds, NHS drug repurposing programme, collaborations with payer

Joint calls between funders

Background: Running joint calls is complex and difficult, e.g. legal, organizational, cross border issues

Aim:

- Very practical → discuss and share best practices on how to perform joint calls
- We will provide template materials to facilitate the creation for joint calls e.g. Template Call text, Guidelines for applicants (if needed), Preproposal format (if applicable), Full proposal format, Governance of the Call, Memorandum of Understanding, Joint Controller Agreement → Guiding document due Sept 2024
- Find synergy with other projects/partnerships such as ERA4Health, ERDERA, ATTRACT
- Explore funding policy changes to encourage more joint calls



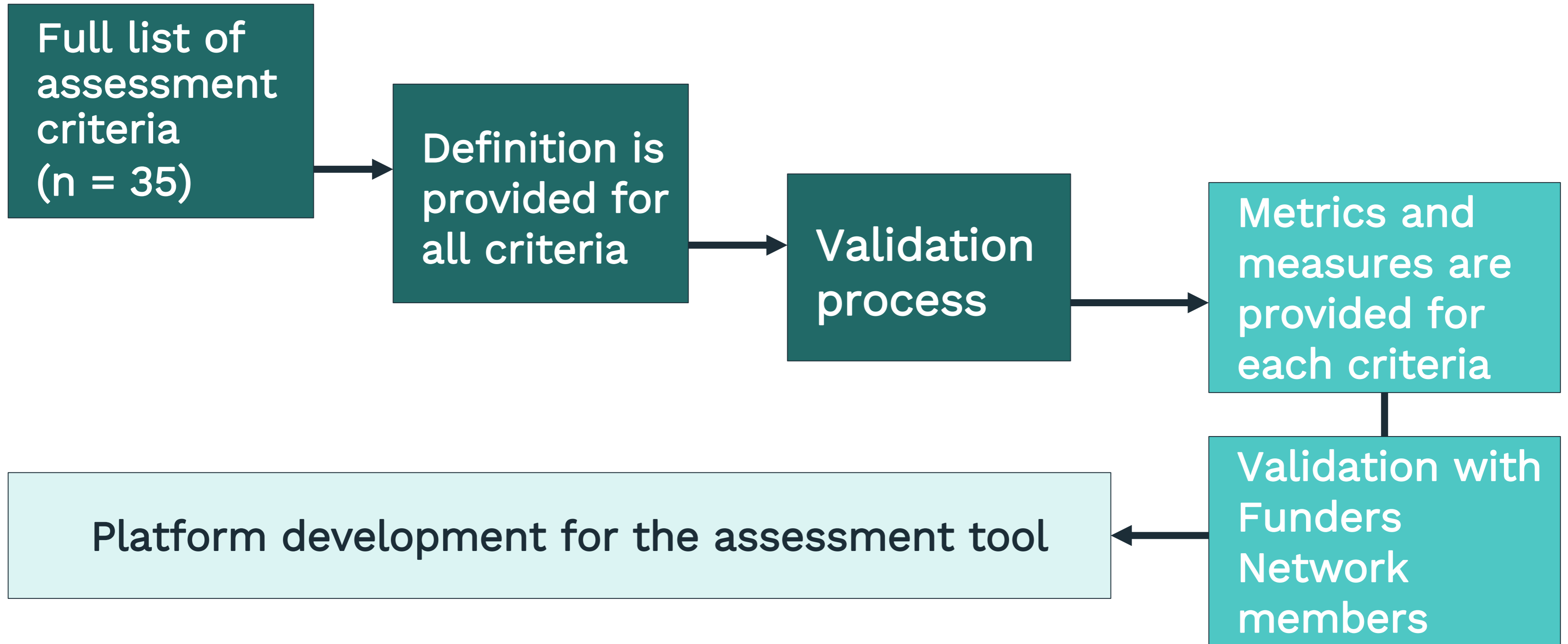

-  Testing period on real-life or hypothetical DR cases with interactive collaboration before launch of the final tool



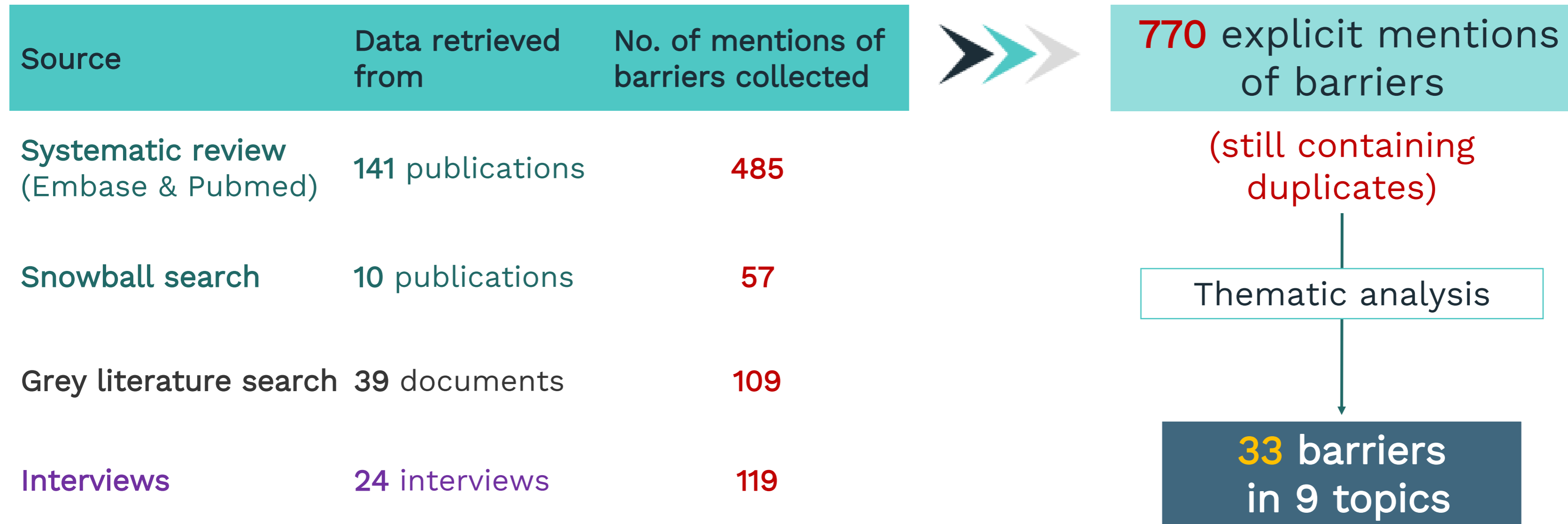

April/May 2024: Think tank on barriers to DR

- The list of barriers should reflect the **current policy problems**
- It needs to be validated by different stakeholder groups, **including the funders!**

Aim:

To review and modify the list of barriers collected from the literature (review structure, wording, add or delete barriers)

June 2024: Online policy survey to prioritise barriers

- A wide range of barriers were identified, and we would like to focus the project resources on the **most relevant ones**
- Participants will be asked to rank the final barriers on their **impact and actionability**

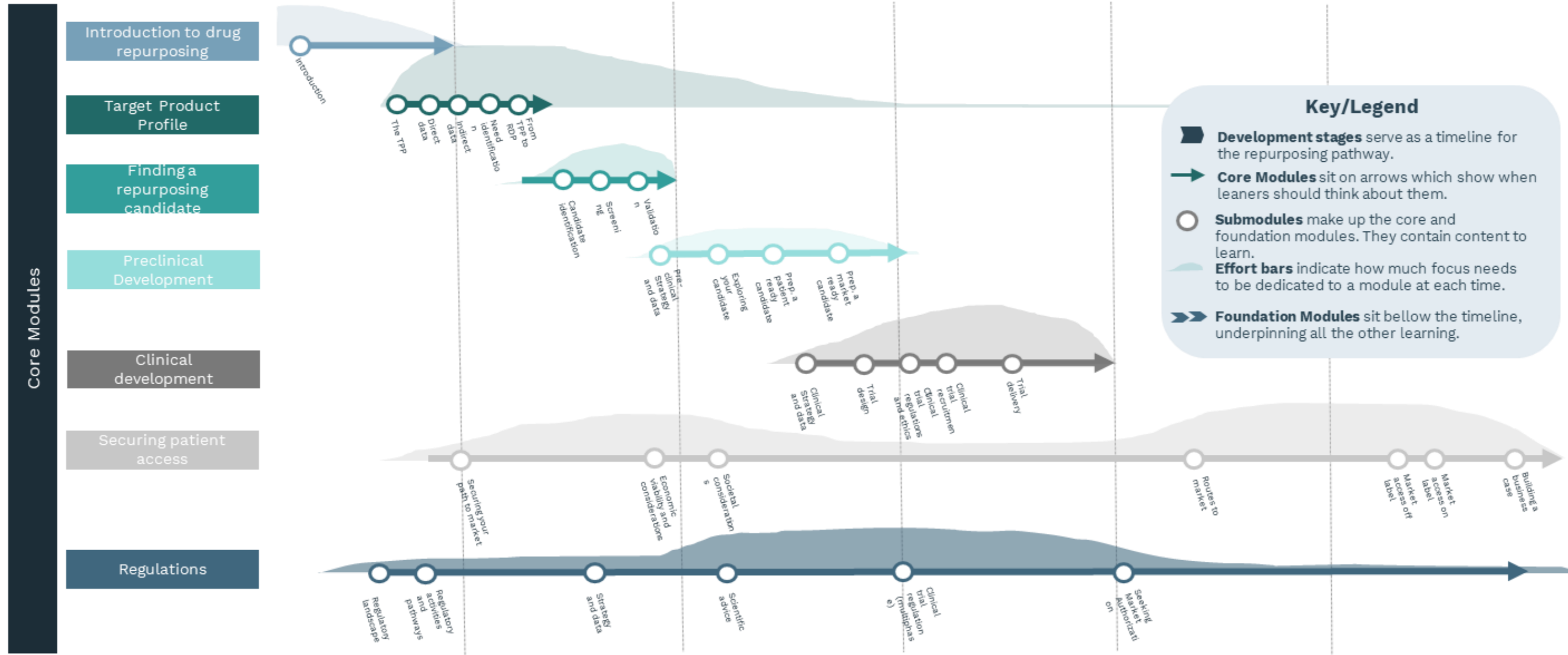
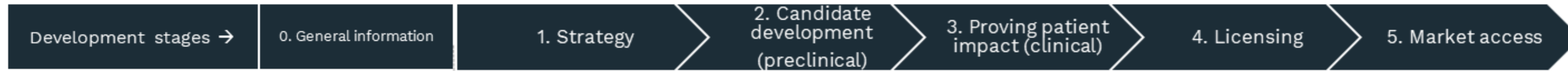

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The REMEDI4LL repurposing curriculum...

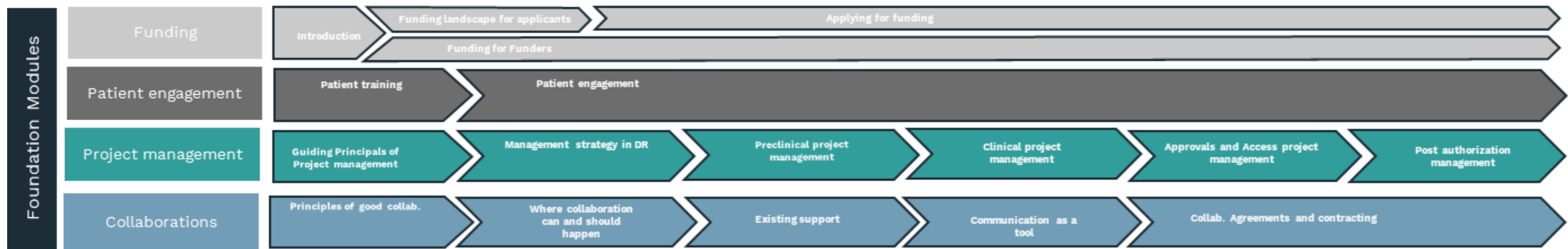




Key/Legend

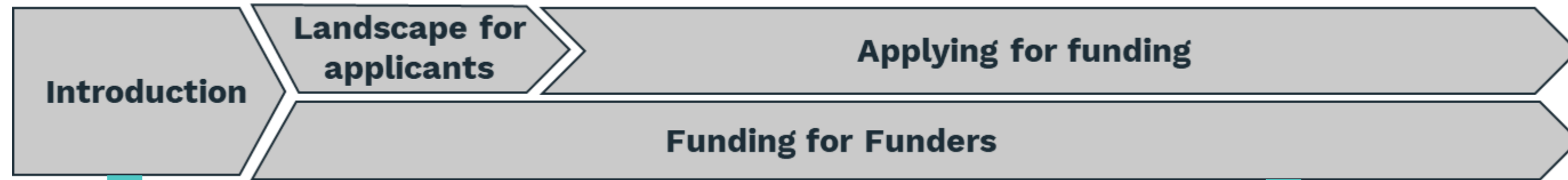
- Development stages serve as a timeline for the repurposing pathway.
- Core Modules sit on arrows which show when learners should think about them.
- Submodules make up the core and foundation modules. They contain content to learn.
- Effort bars indicate how much focus needs to be dedicated to a module at each time.
- Foundation Modules sit below the timeline, underpinning all the other learning.
